


Successfully Housed




The successful housing destination most often achieved throughout the first quarter of 2016 was Rental by Client, with No Ongoing Subsidy (186), followed by Rental with Other Ongoing Subsidy (96).

During the months of January, February, and March of 2016, adults and children exited homelessness to the following permanent housing destinations:


- Long-term Care Facility or Nursing Home (1)
- VASH rental (13)
- Permanently staying with family (15)
- Rental with other ongoing housing subsidy (96)
- Rental by client, no ongoing subsidy (186).

Homelessness Prevented

8 new people were served through Prevention programs that participate in HMIS over the first quarter of 2016. It is important to note there are other prevention-related activities that are not represented in HMIS, including diversion and services provided by the faith community. We anticipate the addition of prevention programs that will contribute data to HMIS beginning in the second quarter of 2016. Without these interventions, many more individuals and families would likely have experienced homelessness.



Community Spotlight



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The Southeastern Virginia Homeless Coalition (SVHC) conducted both a sheltered and an unsheltered Point in Time Count to fulfill the requirement of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on January 26-27, 2016. Overall, **723 persons** were identified as being homeless in the SVHC during the 24-hour period. The data was collected via HMIS and the *Counting Us* mobile app developed by Simtech Solutions, Inc. *Counting Us* was implemented across the entire Hampton Roads region, including the SVHC, the Greater Virginia Peninsula Homelessness Consortium (GVPHC), the Portsmouth CoC, and the Virginia Beach CoC.
